



Open Publishing

- What is Open Publishing?
 - Can refer to articles, books, research data, multimedia, etc
 - It is freely available online (either immediately or with some delay)
 - Often has few or no restrictions on reuse
- Guidance for managing copyright & author's rights, including licenses for sharing/reuse of a work
- Identifying journal options for open access publishing
- Subsidizing author publishing fees that support open access
 - Currently: Wiley (pilot), Cambridge University Press, PLOS Medicine & PLOS Biology, SCOAP3 (Assorted High Energy Physics) journals





Public Access Requirements

- Public access is currently required after 12 months as from many federal agencies
- Each agency/funder has its own requirements for how, when and where to make a publication available to the public (details @ pas.wisc.edu)
- Changes are coming to federal requirements (including an expansion to all federal agencies) agencies are planning now (so more to come!)
- Non-compliance can result in suspension of a current award or future funding

ORCID Profiles

- Unique identifier for researchers
- Saves you time "enter once, re-use often"
- Increases discoverability of your research outputs
- Researchers can delegate management of their profile to others
- Required by many funders (NIH, NSF, DOE), and publishers (Wiley, Springer Nature, IEEE)

- Profile system for federally funded research
- Required for NIH funding, option for NSF
- Create biosketches tailored to specific grant applications
- Researchers can delegate management to others
- Connects with ORCID










Measuring Research Impact

- Citation counts and analysis
 - Databases like Web of Science,
 Scopus
 - Libraries offer custom reporting
- Broader impacts
 - Greater societal benefit of research
 - Required for some grant applications (NSF)





Citation Managers

- Tools that help you collect, organize, cite, and share references
- Organize all the PDFs of papers from your department into one library
- Analyze those papers based on author, publication source, etc.
- Create citations in any required format for use in grant applications, publications, website posting, etc

new NIH requirements.



- Take effect January 23, 2023
- Feels similar to many existing requirements from other agencies
- Affects all NIH researchers generating scientific data
- Requires a Data Management & Sharing Plan (DMSP)
 - Institutes, Centers and Offices (ICOs) can institute more specific guidance
 - Genomic data policy is still in effect and has specific DMSP guidance
- All scientific data are required to be shared in a timely manner
- Plan will be reviewed and treated as living document
- Non-compliance with the plan after the end of the funding period may affect future funding
- Generalist Repository Ecosystem Initiative (GREI)


